

- If you tested positive for Covid-19 on an Antigen test or PCR and completed your isolation period you do not need a negative Covid-19 test to return to school. This is guidance from both the NJ Department of Health and the CDC.
- If you were exposed to Covid-19 and completed your quarantine period and are asymptomatic you do not need a negative Covid-19 test to return to school. This is guidance from both the NJ Department of Health and the CDC.
- If you tested positive for Covid-19 on an Antigen test you do not need to confirm the positive test with a PCR. A positive Antigen test confirms you have Covid 19 and must follow the isolation precautions. Per the NJ Department of Health and CDC you do not need to test negative to return to school.
- If you tested positive for Covid-19 in the past 90 days and had an exposure but are asymptomatic you do not need to quarantine nor have a test done unless symptomatic.
